Pedro Guillén García

Professor Pedro Guillén García was born in Algaida, Murcia. He studied and completed his degree at the Faculty of Medicine of the Complutense University of Madrid in 1968, integrating during that period in the Chair of Surgical Pathology of Professor Martin Lagos as an intern student to once completed, as Assistant Physician of Traumatology and Orthopedic Surgery with Professor J. Palacios y Carvajal in the Residence La Paz.

Collegiate at the College of Physicians of Madrid number 14,599 in 1964 and Medical Specialist in Traumatology and Orthopedic Surgery in 1979. He obtains the degree of Doctor with a work of Experimental Embryology on "Cellular disaggregates and re-aggregates of the presumptive area of a limb" qualified as outstanding Cum Laude unanimously and at the same time he initiates a roadmap and research for his future. 1986

He was 11 years of teaching contract as Professor at the Official School of Traumatology and Orthopedic Surgery at the Complutense University, where Prof. D. Hipólito Durán was its director from 1972 to 1983.

Corresponding Academician in the Royal National Academy of Medicine of Spain with presence and participation in academic activity, to highlight that in the vote for Full Academician he obtained the pleasure of all but two Academicians, thus occupying on December 3, 2019 the chair number 39 of Traumatology and Orthopedic Surgery succeeding Prof. Hipólito Durán Sacristán.

President of the International Symposia of Orthopedic Surgery and Traumatology at Mafpre-Fremap-CEMTRO since 1974 which are still held as well as the annual International Courses of Knee Pathology which he founded in 1981 and continues to direct.

He was the national director by opposition of the Mapfre-Fremap Medical Services from 1980 to 2000. In 1999 he created the first Master's Degree in Sports Traumatology, a two-year teaching period in which more than 300 doctors-students have passed through the classrooms. In 2004 he was appointed, by the Board of Governors and Senate, Extraordinary Professor of Traumatology at UCAM and in 2010 Honorary Dean. Founded and directed the International Biomedical Research Unit CEMTRO, tissue culture since 2005.

In 1998 he founded the CEMTRO Clinic of which he is Chairman of the Board of Directors and Head of the Department of Traumatology and Orthopedic Surgery, whose surgical activity is invested according to a record of more than 11,000 cases per year. He has made 5 international patents, perhaps the best known among the five is the wireless arthroscope (WAD Dr. Guillén), the catalyst of Minimally Invasive Surgery.

Receives one of the highest academic distinctions, Doctor Honoris Causa by different universities, Cranston University, State of Rhode Island, USA 2004; Universidad Católica San Antonio de Murcia in 2007; Universidad Rey Juan Carlos I in Madrid and Universidad Pontificia de Salamanca in 2015 as well as Honorary Recognition by the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de Méjico in 2014 and Honorary Recognition by the Argentine Senate in 2017.

He created the Dr. Pedro Guillén Foundation whose objective, among others, is the promotion and development of medical-scientific research and innovation, with special attention to the pathologies of the Locomotor System approved and registered on April 11, 2011 by the Ministry of Education, Science and Sport.

It is required prior authorization to institutional courses being perhaps for this reason appointed Member of Honor in various Associations such as the Association or Orthopedic and traumatology of Georgia, Russia in 1983, the Society of Orthopedics and Traumatology of Uruguay in 1987, of AANNA "Academy Arthroscopy Association of North America" of USA in 2004, the Mexican Society of Orthopedics in 2002 and the College of Orthopedics and Traumatology of Mexico in 2008. He is also a Numerary Member of several Associations and Academies such as the Willis Campbell Club of USA, the SECOT, SICOT, IRMA, BRAGS, SETRADE... among others.

He received, among other awards, 19 gold medals to highlight the Gold Medal for merit to work by the Ministry of Labor and Immigration in 2011 or the Gold Medal of Madrid in recognition of his professional career in 2015 as the Cross of Honor of the Madrid Health in Gold category in 2011. He obtains numerous national and international first prizes.

So far, he has carried out as Director-Co-Director 11 Doctoral Theses, all of them graded Excellent cum Laude, judged at the Catholic University San Antonio of Murcia and the Complutense University of Madrid.

He has published as author-co-author 515 articles in which we highlight journals with a high impact index such as Nature, Cartilage, Cell, Lancet Science, etc.
